

Board Positions

The Rotaract Club of Sandy Bay has a leadership team to guide the work of the Club. This is a group of members within the club who have decided they would like to take a step up within the club and become part of the board.

The Rotaract Club of Sandy Bay needs strong leadership from the board to guide on-going operations, plan for the future, engage members and support the Club to evolve over time. Applying to become a board member means that a club member is looking to take on a leadership role within the Club and become accountable for completing certain tasks.

Being a board member comes with extra responsibilities but it is rewarded by gaining extra skills, leading meeting and projects, and surprising yourself at what you can achieve. In order to be an effective board member, it is important to understand what the responsibilities of each board position are, remembering that the Club will be behind you and supporting you.

General Responsibilities:

- Every board member is expected to attend a minimum of eight meetings and/or events with the six-month membership periods unless other arrangements have been made with the President or Vice President.
- Every board member is expected to attend any board specific training run by District 9830 or Rotaract Australia.
- Board members are expected to withdraw from their position if they find they are unable to meet their commitments during the year.

Board Elections

Here is some important information you should also know regarding the election of board positions and making decisions as a board or club:

- Board members are to be elected before March 1 each year with each position coming into effect on July 1 of the year the election is held. Elections require 14 days notice in writing to members.
- A majority of members in good standing constitutes as quorum at any regular or special meeting of the club and any four members of the board, one of whom must be President or Vice-President, constitutes as quorum at any meeting of the board.
- Changes to by-laws (including board titles) can happen with a majority but need 14 days written notice of the meeting where the vote will be held and acceptance of the outcome by the sponsoring Rotary Club
